

# THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

# So Many Mansions!

This is such an interesting time for Martha and me. My retirement is scheduled to begin after my last service at St. Paul on July 14<sup>th</sup>, and Martha is also retiring from teaching music at Trinity Lutheran in Burr Ridge and serving as Business Manager of Haven for Tots Preschool. While I know many of you have already navigated leaving full time employment, it is (for most of us, Ruth...:) a one-time experience, and there is some trepidation.

For us, along with retirement comes relocation. We'll be returning to Eastern Iowa, where we lived before I began 4 years of seminary education which would ultimately land us here with you at St. Paul Lutheran Church, never imagining that we would be blessed to remain here for my entire 25-year ministry!

So now, we are in the process of doing something that is unfamiliar to us – simultaneously selling our home in Oak Lawn and purchasing our new home in Walcott, IA. When we left Davenport, all we had to do was pack up and sell our home. We didn't have to worry about finding another house to move into for the next 4 years because we lived in seminary housing, so that was relatively easy.

But now we've got (as most people would) the 2 transactions of buying and selling happening at once, and for real excitement, there were things that demanded our attention during holy week... but as always, God's timing is perfect and everything continues to move along more or less smoothly.

The experience of buying our home in Oak Lawn was a bit unusual. Bob Rogers, who was St. Paul's Head Elder at the time, also worked in Real Estate, and we had a ball looking at 44 different houses in Oak Lawn and surrounding communities with him. There were so many that we had to take notes and give them nicknames so we could remember them all. We also greatly appreciated Ruth and Wil Sievers, who welcomed us into their home and helped us get acclimated while we were house shopping in this new and strange land. On our first visit to St. Paul, construction of the north wing of the school was just beginning. Also, our first meeting with Jerry McFarlin and Rich Briede found them cleaning graffiti off the walls in the school hallway after a break-in and little spate of vandalism occurred the night before. By God's grace and a lot of diligence on the part of everyone who has keys to the building, St. Paul thankfully has been shielded from any further events like that.

Our house shopping experience this time has been much different. We became aware of the house we are planning to buy in lowa last fall, but it wasn't listed until early March. Our realtor there was vigilant and let us know as soon as it became available. You know what they say about "location X3," and it seems like this house couldn't be in a better place. After much prayer and deliberation, we made an offer and it was accepted. And while we really do like many things about the house, another important factor in the decision is that there have been virtually no other houses of the size, location, style, amount of property, etc. that would be right for us—all helping us to see God's hand at work in this as it is in all things!

I have to give a shout out and an advertising plug for LCEF, the *Lutheran Church Extension Fund*. They exist to help with various financial services including investment opportunities for congregations and members, which in turn enables them to make loans to help congregations, church workers, and members as they have need. They are helping us with a mortgage loan to bridge the time of the purchase of our new home until the sale of our home in Oak Lawn. If you're not already familiar with them, check them out at LCEF.org.

So even though it seems like there has been a shortage of available homes in the current housing market, there is one place where there is no shortage. Jesus promises, "…In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. And where I go you know, and the way you know." That way, He said, is found in Him alone: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14, NKJV)

What a wonderful thing we and all who believe can anticipate with full confidence, when we will all be together again in the perfection of His Light and His love in His eternal kingdom!
