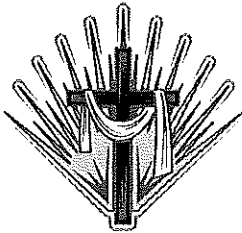

HOLY WEEK WORSHIP SCHEDULE

PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 24, 9AM

On this day we remember our Lord's entry into Jerusalem by a crowd filled with anticipation for the coming Messiah. However, Jesus was going to Jerusalem to suffer and die for the sins of the world. We recreate the day in our worship but all the while our eyes look ahead to the cross and the events of the coming week. Holy Communion is a part of our worship service.

MAUNDY THURSDAY, MARCH 28, 11AM & 7PM

Two traditional communion services are held, one during the day and the other in the evening. We focus on the gift of the blessed Sacrament of Holy Communion, given by our Lord to His church on the first Maundy Thursday, when He told us, "*do this in remembrance of Me.*"

GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 29, 11AM & 7PM

At noon on the first Good Friday, our Lord was on the cross, dying for you and for all mankind. The service of Tenebrae, the "*Service of Darkness,*" is one of the most moving services of the year, as one by one the candles are extinguished, and in growing darkness we remember our Lord's suffering, death and burial. Both services are Tenebrae services.

EASTER, MARCH 31, 9AM

We give thanks on this day with special festival services for Jesus' resurrection from the dead ~ the assurance that He is the victorious Lord over life and death, and the assurance that we too shall be raised from the dead. We are united to our crucified and risen Savior through the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

We Preach Christ Crucified!

Recently, I ran across this letter from Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison, the president of our Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod. It was written as an open invitation to worship with us, but it's also an appropriate reminder for all of us of the reason we are certain of our salvation. Christ was indeed crucified for the sins of the world, but He also rose to life again three days later in His triumphant resurrection victory over sin, death and Satan for all who believe. Here is Pastor Harrison's letter:

More than a decade ago, the total amount of digital information in the world first reached a zettabyte, or 1 billion terabytes. That's an amount of information so large that it boggles the mind. We have more information available in our pocket than people have had at any point in human history. Yet as we are reminded daily, not all of that information is trustworthy. Instead, we are plagued by misinformation and disinformation, and we often don't know where to turn.

Into this confusion, God has sent us one certain thing: His Son, Jesus Christ, who died on the cross on Good Friday and was raised again three days later on Easter Sunday. Through these actions, He took away the sins of the entire world. He did all this for you and for me.

What's more, God tells us that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). His truth is unchanging. It can't be altered by governments or fact-checkers or the changeable whims of culture. It's not like a Wikipedia page that can be different from one day to the next. In God's Word, we find a certainty that is available nowhere else.

That's why Christians stick to the Bible with its clear message of Christ crucified. It makes the wisdom of the world nothing.


"Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe" (1 Corinthians 1:20–21). We preach Christ, no matter who calls it folly.

And we know that the message of Jesus Christ is for every single person. Christ hung on the cross ... for you. Christ took His last breath ... for you. Christ conquered sin and death and was raised to life ... for you.

God was in Christ, reconciling the world to Himself. No matter who calls it folly, it is the wisdom and the power of God Almighty. We preach Christ crucified. So, this Lent and every day, grab hold of Christ in His Word and gather with fellow believers around His altar.

The churches of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) proclaim the truth of Jesus Christ today and always. Please join us for worship anytime as we celebrate God's love and forgiveness, which is only found in His Son, and share this invitation as God gives you the opportunity.

MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS: Dear Fellow Members of St. Paul: The Elders pray that the first two months of 2024 brought you closer to God and to the community of believers at St. Paul. Our church offers many opportunities for spiritual development, Christian fellowship, service to area residents, and local and international evangelism. At St. Paul, we honor God's admonitions to study his Word (*All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness. 2 Timothy 3:16*), to support each other spiritually, emotionally, and materially (*Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. 1 Peter 4:10*), to provide generous lovingkindness to people around us (*Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. Matthew 25:40*), and to share the message and teachings of Christ at home and abroad (*Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the end of the age. Matthew 28:19-20*).

February was filled with exciting highlights. On 11 February, our church returned to distributing Holy Communion at the rail. Many members report feeling a more intimate relationship with God and the Sacrament when they receive the Lord's Supper in that manner. St. Paul offered two services on Ash Wednesday and hosted a breakfast in the morning. Midweek Lenten services resumed on Wednesday, 21 February, each service preceded by a meal and a hymn sing. Our boards and committees were once again hard at work after a brief Christmas break. The Elders thank St. Paul's many volunteers and hope that more members will participate actively in our many projects and outreach programs; we also ask you to consider becoming involved in church governance.

March promises to be equally inspiring and stimulating. Please consult information in our Sunday bulletin or in this newsletter for a schedule of Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday services. We pray that we may always be mindful of God's great love and sacrifice for us; we also ask that our hearts be filled with true joy and gratitude. May we have the ability to discern God's presence in all aspects of our lives, and may we never lose faith in God's control and oversight of our past, present, and future (*For I know the plans I have for you ... plans to prosper you ... to give you hope and a future. MESSAGE FROM OPERATION BARNABAS: Here we are, it's March, and winter is almost over, we hope. We are continuing to send care packages to troops deployed around the world. Know that you, through the care packages, have raised the morale of a lot of troops. These troops are far from home, and for some it's the first time they are outside the U.S. The care packages give them a little taste of home and a reminder that there is a large group of citizens who care and support them.

If you care to send a note to a service man or woman, there will be blank note cards in the narthex to the right of the church office door. When you are done writing your note, just seal the envelope and address it to "THE TROOPS", then drop it in the "Military Mailbox", next to the blank cards. We will add the cards to the care packages. So, all you have to do is write the note. Thank you for your help and contributions.

We are also supporting veterans at Manteno and Hines Veterans homes. We will again be collecting puzzle books (Word Search, Sudoku, and Crossword) through the months of March and April. MESSAGE FROM FAITH IN ACTION / SOCIAL MINISTRIES: We are so thankful for what God has done for us that we are sharing His love for Easter. Preparations are being made for our Easter holiday bags which will be distributed on March 6th and March 27th. We receive around 5-6 new clients/month. In 2023, we served 127 families and 891 bags. At Christmas we were blessed to serve 85 families with holiday bags. We feel this Easter we will be blessed to serve about the same number of clients. We are so happy God put these wonderful people in our path, and that we are able to be the hands and feet of Jesus and share His love with them. We were blessed to get a great BOGO on pork tenderloins at Jewel, plus the Elmhurst food pantry also gifted us with five holiday hams. We are blessed to add these meat items to our Easter bags. The bags will also include another 13 items to help make the holiday special. Unfortunately, prices are still skyrocketing, and you can imagine how God has challenged us to serve others. We have been blessed with our partnership with other food pantries, plus financial and food pantry gifts from St. Paul congregation. Thrivent also blessed us with another \$250 Visa card for the Easter holiday bags. We are always open for your help to support our food pantry. Your support with financial gifts as well as food pantry items are always welcome. If you would like to help the food pantry the following items are always in short supply: Hamburger Helper/Suddenly Salad; oatmeal, cereal, meal in a can items including soups, stews, chili, Chef

We are happy to inspire our clients with spiritual comfort as well. We have been sharing Portals of Prayer and also the Lent and Advent devotionals with our clients for over a year now. Our clients love them, and these devotionals help encourage them through their life journeys. This is another way you can help our ministry. You can support this outreach with a financial gift to St. Paul and write Portals of Prayer on the envelope or by-line. Thank you for also supporting our clients with your prayers.

We are also thankful for our food pantry partners. Along with the grocery items in our bags, we have been able to include meat, produce, eggs, dairy items, plus juice and other beverages because of their donations. With thankful hearts, we acknowledge our sponsors. In February, we received over 81 pounds of bread and pastries from Kevin McCarthy with Panera, over 610 pounds of vegetables, fruit, and beverages from Operation Blessing, over 1928 pounds of frozen items including meat, beverages, flour, cereal, and snacks; fresh produce & bakery items, and shelf stable groceries from Jayne Siou with "Put Your Hands Together" Immanuel, Hillside. Along with these sponsors we also received 330 pounds from the Oak Lawn Library, 196 pounds from Food 4 Less in Alsip, and 192 rolls of toilet paper from Linda Kosary. What a blessing! Wow! We thank our food pantry team for their backbreaking work and unbelievable volunteer hours processing those wonderful groceries, driving to make food rescue pick-ups, and delivering groceries into the cars and sometimes to the homes of our clients that cannot get to our food pantry because of illness or other circumstances. You are always willing to join our team, just call the church office and leave us a message (food pantry x18).

We also thank the St. Paul men's cook team and our BED's serving team for their service during the winter season. With their help we were able to offer meals for the homeless once a month. Thank you, God, for putting these heartfelt people together!

Thank you also to Thrivent Financial for their support of our ministry with their \$250 Visa card and t-shirts. If you would like a t-shirt, please let us know, we would love to gift one to you. We will also have T-shirts available during the Elders "Volunteer Sunday". Please take a shirt, or two or three. Yes, you are a volunteer; with your prayers and contributions of time, talents, and groceries!

Gardening season is coming soon, and we are already planning for the gardens! More to come in the April newsletter. Before you toss those poinsettia and Easter pots, we can use them for our garden! We are also saving egg cartons and we still need grocery bags, especially the paper bags and shopping bags. Thank you!

Through you and our sponsors we have been blessed to serve those in need. **February Food pantry** served 92 families, 249 individuals. **BEDS cook team** cooked for 20 individuals. Thank you for your constant support of our missions.
